Book of ZECHARIAH

CHAPTER 1

- 1 In the eighth month, in the second year of Darius, came the Word of the Lord unto Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, the son of Iddo the prophet, saying, 2 The Lord has been sore displeased with your fathers. 3 Therefore say unto them, Thus says the Lord of hosts; Turn you unto me --and I will turn unto you --says the Lord of hosts.
- 4 Be you not as your fathers, unto whom the former prophets have cried, saying, Thus says the Lord of hosts; **Turn you now from your Evil Ways,** --<u>and from your evil doings:</u> but --they did Not hear, nor hearken/listen unto me, says the Lord.
- 5 Your fathers, where are they? and the prophets, do they live forever? 6 But my Words and my statutes, which I commanded my servants the prophets, did they not take hold of your fathers? and they returned and said, Like, as the Lord of hosts thought to do unto us, according to our ways, and according to our doings --so has God --dealt with us.
- 7 Upon the four and twentieth day of the eleventh month, which is the month Sebat, in the second year of Darius, came the Word of the Lord unto Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, the son of Iddo the prophet, saying, 8 I saw by night, and behold a Man riding upon a red horse, and he stood among the myrtle trees that were in the bottom; and behind him were there red horses, speckled, and white.
- 9 Then said I, O my lord, what are these? And the Angel that talked with me said unto me, I will show you what these be. 10 And the man that stood among the myrtle trees answered and said,
- These are they whom the Lord has sent to walk to and fro through the earth. 11 And they answered the Angel of the Lord that stood among the myrtle trees, and said, We have walked to and fro through the earth, and, behold, all the earth sits still, and is at rest.
- 12 Then the Angel of the Lord answered and said, O Lord of hosts --How long will you Not have Mercy on Jerusalem and on the cities of Judah, against which you have had Indignation/righteous anger --these 70 years? 13 And the Lord answered the Angel that talked with me with good Words and comfortable Words.
- 14 Then the Angel who was speaking to me said, "Proclaim this Word: This is what the Lord Almighty says: 'I am very jealous for Jerusalem and Zion, 15 and I am very angry with the nations that feel secure. I was only a little angry, but they went too far with the punishment.'

- 16 "Therefore this is what the Lord says: 'I will return to Jerusalem with mercy, and there my house will be rebuilt. And the measuring line will be stretched out over Jerusalem,' declares the Lord Almighty.
- 17 "Proclaim further: This is what the Lord Almighty says: 'My towns will again overflow with prosperity, and the Lord will again comfort Zion and choose Jerusalem."
- 18 Then I looked up, and there before me were four horns. 19 I asked the Angel who was speaking to me, "What are these?"

He answered me, "These are the horns that scattered Judah, Israel and Jerusalem."

20 Then the Lord showed me four craftsmen. 21 I asked, "What are these coming to do?"

He answered, "These are the horns that scattered Judah so that no one could raise their head, but the craftsmen have come to terrify them and throw down these horns of the nations who lifted up their horns against the land of Judah to scatter its people.

CHAPTER 2

1 Then I looked up, and there before me was a man with a measuring line in his hand. 2 I asked, "Where are you going?"

He answered me, "To measure Jerusalem, to find out how wide and how long it is."

- 3 While the Angel who was speaking to me was leaving, another Angel came to meet him 4 and said to him: "Run, tell that young man, 'Jerusalem will be a city without walls because of the great number of people and animals in it.
- 5 And I myself will be a wall of fire around it,' declares the Lord, 'and I will be its glory within.'
- 6 "Come, Flee from the land of the north," declares the Lord, "for I have scattered you to the four winds of heaven," declares the Lord.
- 7 "Come, Zion, Escape, you who live in Daughter Babylon" 8 For this is what the Lord Almighty says: "After the Glorious One has sent me against the nations that have plundered you—for whoever touches you touches the apple of His eye—
- 9 I will surely raise my hand against them so that their slaves/servants will plunder them. Then you will know that the Lord Almighty has sent me.
- 10 "Shout and be glad, Daughter Zion. For I am coming, and I will live among you," declares the Lord. 11 "Many nations will be joined with the Lord in that day and will become my people. I will live among you and you will know that the Lord Almighty has sent me to you. 12 The Lord will inherit Judah as his portion in the holy land and will again choose Jerusalem.

13 Be Still --before the Lord, all mankind, because he has roused himself from his holy dwelling."

CHAPTER 3

- 1 Then he showed me Joshua the high priest standing before the Angel of the Lord, and satan standing at his right side to accuse him. 2 The Lord said to satan,
- "The Lord rebuke you, satan, The Lord, who has chosen Jerusalem, rebuke you, is not this man a burning stick snatched from the fire?"
- 3 Now Joshua was dressed in filthy clothes as he stood before the Angel. 4 The Angel said to those who were standing before him, "Take off his filthy clothes."

Then he said to Joshua, "See, I have taken away your sin, and I will put fine garments on you."

- 5 Then I said, "Put a clean turban on his head." So, they put a clean turban on his head and clothed him, while the Angel of the Lord stood by.
- 6 The Angel of the Lord gave this charge to Joshua: 7 "This is what the Lord Almighty says: 'If you will walk in obedience to me and keep my requirements/commands/Words, then you will govern my house and have charge of my courts, and I will give you a place among these standing here.
- 8 "Listen, High Priest Joshua, you and your associates seated before you, who are men symbolic of things to come: I am going to bring my servant, the Branch. 9 See, the stone I have set in front of Joshua There are seven eyes on that one stone, and I will engrave an inscription on it,' says the Lord Almighty, 'and I will remove the sin of this land in a single day.

10 "In that day each of you will invite your neighbor to sit under your vine and fig tree,' declares the Lord Almighty."

CHAPTER 4

1 Then the Angel who talked with me returned and woke me up, like someone awakened from sleep. 2 He asked me, "What do you see?"

I answered, "I see a solid gold lampstand with a bowl at the top and seven lamps on it, with seven channels to the lamps. 3 Also there are two olive trees by it, one on the right of the bowl and the other on its left."

- 4 I asked the Angel who talked with me, "What are these, my lord?"
- 5 He answered, "Do you not know what these are?"
- "No, my lord," I replied.

- 6 So he said to me, "This is the Word of the Lord to Zerubbabel:
- 'Not by might nor by power, --but by my Spirit,' says the Lord Almighty.
- 7 "What are you, mighty mountain? Before Zerubbabel you will become level ground. Then he will bring out the capstone to shouts of 'God bless it God bless it"
- 8 Then the Word of the Lord came to me: 9 "The hands of Zerubbabel have laid the foundation of this temple; his hands will also complete it. Then you will know that the Lord Almighty has sent me to you.
- 10 "Don't despise -- the Day -- of small things/beginnings,
- since the seven eyes of the Lord that range throughout the earth will rejoice when they see the chosen capstone in the hand of Zerubbabel?"
- 11 Then I asked the Angel, "What are these two olive trees on the right and the left of the lampstand?"
- 12 Again I asked him, "What are these two olive branches beside the two gold pipes that pour out golden oil?"
- 13 He replied, "Do you not know what these are?"
- "No, my lord," I said.
- 14 So he said, "These are the two who are anointed to serve the Lord of all the earth."

- 1 I looked again, and there before me was a flying scroll.
- 2 He asked me, "What do you see?"

I answered, "I see a flying scroll, twenty cubits long and ten cubits wide."

- 3 And he said to me, "This is the Curse --that is going out over the whole land; for according to what it says on one side, every thief will be banished, and according to what it says on the other, everyone who swears falsely will be banished.
- 4 The Lord Almighty declares, 'I will send it out, and it will enter the house of the thief and the house of anyone who swears falsely by my name. It will remain in that house and destroy it completely, both its timbers and its stones."
- 5 Then the Angel who was speaking to me came forward and said to me, "Look up and see what is appearing."
- 6 I asked, "What is it?"
- He replied, "It is a basket." And he added, "This is the iniquity/sinning of the people throughout the land."
- 7 Then the cover of lead was raised, and there in the basket sat a woman 8 He said,

- "This is wickedness," and he pushed her back into the basket and pushed its lead cover down on it.
- 9 Then I looked up—and there before me were two women, with the wind in their wings They had wings like those of a stork, and they lifted up the basket between heaven and earth.
- 10 "Where are they taking the basket?" I asked the Angel who was speaking to me.
- 11 He replied, "To the country of Babylonia to build a house for it. When the house is ready, the basket will be set there in its place."

- 1 I looked up again, and there before me were four chariots coming out from between two mountains—mountains of bronze. 2 The first chariot had red horses, the second black, 3 the third white, and the fourth dappled—all of them powerful. 4 I asked the Angel who was speaking to me, "What are these, my lord?"
- 5 The Angel answered me, "These are --the Four Spirits of Heaven, going out from standing in the presence of the Lord of the whole world. 6 The one with the black horses is going toward the north country, the one with the white horses toward the west, and the one with the dappled horses toward the south."
- 7 When the powerful horses went out, they were straining to go throughout the earth. And he said, "Go throughout the earth" So they went throughout the earth.
- 8 Then he called to me, "Look, those going toward the north country have given my Spirit rest in the land of the north."
- 9 The Word of the Lord came to me: 10 "Take silver and gold from the exiles Heldai, Tobijah and Jedaiah, who have arrived from Babylon. Go the same day to the house of Josiah son of Zephaniah.
- 11 Take the silver and gold and make a crown, and set it on the head of the high priest, Joshua son of Jozadak.
- 12 Tell him this is what the Lord Almighty says: 'Here is the man whose name is the Branch, and he will branch out from his place and build the temple of the Lord.
- 13 It is he who will build the temple of the Lord, and he will be clothed with majesty and will sit and rule on his throne. And he will be a priest on his throne. And there will be harmony between the two.'
- 14 The crown will be given to Heldai, Tobijah, Jedaiah and Hen son of Zephaniah as a memorial in the temple of the Lord.
- 15 Those who are far away will come and help to build the temple of the Lord, and you will know that the Lord Almighty has sent me to you.

1 Now in the fourth year of King Darius it came to pass that the Word of the Lord came to Zechariah, on the fourth day of the ninth month, Chislev, 2 when the people sent Sherezer, with Regem-Melech and his men, to the house of God, to pray before the Lord,

3 and to ask the priests who were in the house of the Lord of hosts, and the prophets, saying, "Should I weep in the fifth month and fast as I have done for so many years?"

4 Then the Word of the Lord of hosts came to me, saying, 5 "Say to all the people of the land, and to the priests: 'When you fasted and mourned in the fifth and seventh months during those seventy years, did you really fast for Me—for Me? 6 When you eat and when you drink, do you not eat and drink for yourselves?

7 Should you not have obeyed the Words which the Lord proclaimed through the former prophets when Jerusalem and the cities around it were inhabited and prosperous, and the South and the Lowland were inhabited?"

8 Then the Word of the Lord came to Zechariah, saying, 9 "Thus says the Lord of hosts:

'Execute true justice,

Show mercy -- and compassion

Everyone to his brother, and sister.

10 Do not oppress the widow or the fatherless,

The alien/outsider or the poor.

Let none of you plan evil in their heart

Against their brother or sister.'

11 "But they refused to heed, shrugged their shoulders, and stopped their ears so that they could not hear. 12 Yes, they made their hearts like flint, refusing to hear the law and the Words which the Lord of hosts had sent by His Spirit through the former prophets. Thus, great wrath came from the Lord of hosts.

13 Therefore it happened, that just as He proclaimed and they would not hear, so they called out and I would not listen," says the Lord of hosts. 14 "But I scattered them with a whirlwind among all the nations which they had not known. Thus, the land became desolate after them, so that no one passed through or returned; for they made the pleasant land desolate."

CHAPTER 8

1 Again the Word of the Lord of hosts came, saying, 2 "Thus says the Lord of hosts:

'I am zealous for Zion with great zeal;

With great fervor I am zealous for her.'

3 "Thus says the Lord:

'I will return to Zion, And dwell in the midst of Jerusalem. Jerusalem shall be called the City of Truth, The Mountain of the Lord of hosts, The Holy Mountain.'

4 "Thus says the Lord of hosts:

'Old men and old women shall again sit In the streets of Jerusalem, Each one with their staff in their hand Because of great age. 5 The streets of the city Shall be full of boys and girls Playing in its streets.'

6 "Thus says the Lord of hosts:

'If it is marvelous in the eyes of the remnant of this people in these days, Will it also be marvelous in My eyes?'
Says the Lord of hosts.

7 "Thus says the Lord of hosts:

'Behold, I will save My people from the land of the east And from the land of the west; 8 I will bring them back, And they shall dwell in the midst of Jerusalem. They shall be My people And I will be their God, In truth and righteousness.'

9 "Thus says the Lord of hosts:

'Let your hands be strong,
You who have been hearing in these days
These Words by the mouth of the prophets,
Who spoke in the day the foundation was laid
For the house of the Lord of hosts,
That the temple might be built.
10 For before these days

There were no wages for man nor any hire for beast; There was no peace from the enemy for whoever went out or came in; For I set all people, everyone, against their neighbor. 11 But now I will not treat the remnant of this people as in the former days,' says the Lord of hosts.

12 'For the seed shall be prosperous,

The vine shall give its fruit,

The ground shall give her increase,

And the heavens shall give their dew—

I will cause the remnant of this people

To possess all these.

13 And it shall come to pass

That just as you were a curse among the nations,

O house of Judah and house of Israel,

So I will save you, and you shall be a blessing.

Do not Fear,

Let your hands be strong.'

14 "For thus says the Lord of hosts:

'Just as I determined to punish you

When your fathers provoked Me to wrath,'

Says the Lord of hosts,

'And I would not relent,

15 So again in these days

I am determined to do good

To Jerusalem and to the house of Judah.

Do not fear.

16 These are the things you shall do:

Speak each person -- the Truth to their neighbor;

Give judgment in your gates for --truth, justice, and peace;

17 Let none of you think evil in your heart -- against your neighbor;

And do not love a false oath/Lying.

For all these are things that I Hate,'

Says the Lord."

18 Then the Word of the Lord of hosts came to me, saying, 19 "Thus says the Lord of hosts:

'The fast of the fourth month,

The fast of the fifth,

The fast of the seventh,

And the fast of the tenth,

Shall be joy and gladness and cheerful feasts

For the house of Judah.

Therefore love truth and peace.'

20 "Thus says the Lord of hosts:

'Peoples shall yet come,

Inhabitants of many cities;

21 The inhabitants of one city shall go to another, saying,

"Let us continue to go and pray before the Lord,

And seek the Lord of hosts.

I myself will go also."

22 Yes, many peoples and strong nations

Shall come to Seek the Lord of hosts in Jerusalem,

And to Pray before the Lord.'

23 "Thus says the Lord of hosts: 'In those days ten men from every language of the nations shall grasp the sleeve of a Jewish man, saying, "Let us go with you, for we have heard that God is with you."

CHAPTER 9

1 The burden of the Word of the Lord

Against the land of Hadrach,

And Damascus its resting place

(For the eyes of men

And all the tribes of Israel

Are on the Lord);

2 Also against Hamath, which borders on it,

And against Tyre and Sidon, though they are very wise.

3 For Tyre built herself a tower,

Heaped up silver like the dust,

And gold like the mire of the streets.

4 Behold, the Lord will cast her out;

He will destroy her power in the sea,

And she will be devoured by fire.

5 Ashkelon shall see it and fear;

Gaza also shall be very sorrowful;

And Ekron, for He dried up her expectation.

The king shall perish from Gaza,

And Ashkelon shall not be inhabited.

6 "A mixed race shall settle in Ashdod,

And I will cut off the pride of the Philistines.

7 I will take away the blood from his mouth,

And the abominations from between his teeth.

But he who remains, even he shall be for our God,

And shall be like a leader in Judah,

And Ekron like a Jebusite.

8 I will camp around My house

Because of the army,

Because of him who passes by and him who returns.

No more shall an oppressor pass through them,

For now I have seen with My eyes.

9 "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion

Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem

Behold, your King is coming to you;

He/Jesus Christ is just and having salvation,

Lowly and riding on a donkey,

A colt, the foal of a donkey.

10 I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim

And the horse from Jerusalem;

The battle bow shall be cut off.

He shall speak peace to the nations;

His dominion shall be 'from sea to sea,

And from the River to the ends of the earth.'

11 "As for you also,

Because of the blood of your covenant,

I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit.

12 Return to the stronghold,

You prisoners of hope.

Even today I declare

That I will restore double to you.

13 For I have bent Judah, My bow,

Fitted the bow with Ephraim,

And raised up your sons, O Zion,

Against your sons, O Greece,

And made you like the sword of a mighty man."

14 Then the Lord will be seen over them,

And His arrow will go forth like lightning.

The Lord God will blow the trumpet,

And go with whirlwinds from the south.

15 The Lord of hosts will defend them;

They shall devour and subdue with sling stones. They shall drink and roar as if with wine; They shall be filled with blood like basins, Like the corners of the altar.

16 The Lord their God will save them in that day, As the flock of His people.

For they shall be like the jewels of a crown, Lifted like a banner over His land—

17 For how great is its goodness

And how great its beauty

Grain shall make the young men thrive,

And new wine the young women.

CHAPTER 10

1 Ask the Lord for rain In the time of the latter rain. The Lord will make flashing clouds; He will give them showers of rain, Grass in the field for everyone.

2 For the idols speak delusion;
The diviners envision lies,
And tell false dreams;
They comfort in vain.
Therefore the people go/follow their way like sheep;
They are in trouble because there is no shepherd.

3 "My Anger is kindled against the shepherds,
And I will punish the goatherds.
For the Lord of hosts will visit His flock,
The house of Judah,
And will make them as His royal horse in the battle.
4 From him comes the cornerstone,
From him the tent peg,
From him the battle bow,
From him every ruler together.
5 They shall be like mighty men,
Who tread down their enemies
In the mire of the streets in the battle.
They shall fight because the Lord is with them,
And the riders on horses shall be put to shame.

6 "I will strengthen the house of Judah,

And I will save the house of Joseph.

I will bring them back,

Because I have Mercy on them.

They shall be as though -- I had not cast them aside;

For I am the Lord their God,

And I will hear them.

7 Those of Ephraim shall be like a mighty man,

And their heart shall rejoice as if with wine.

Yes, their children shall see it and be glad;

Their heart shall rejoice in the Lord.

8 I will whistle for them and gather them,

For I will redeem them;

And they shall increase as they once increased.

9 "I will sow them among the peoples,

And they shall remember Me in far countries;

They shall live, together with their children,

And they shall return.

10 I will also bring them back from the land of Egypt,

And gather them from Assyria.

I will bring them into the land of Gilead and Lebanon,

Until no more room is found for them.

11 He shall pass through the sea with affliction,

And strike the waves of the sea:

All the depths of the River shall dry up.

Then the pride of Assyria shall be brought down,

And the scepter of Egypt shall depart.

12 "So I will strengthen them in the Lord, And they shall walk up and down in His name,"

Says the Lord.

CHAPTER 11

1 Open your doors, O Lebanon,

That fire may devour your cedars.

2 Wail, O cypress, for the cedar has fallen,

Because the mighty trees are ruined.

Wail, O oaks of Bashan,

For the thick forest has come down.

3 There is the sound of wailing shepherds

For their glory is in ruins.

There is the sound of roaring lions

For the pride of the Jordan is in ruins.

- 4 Thus says the Lord my God, "Feed the flock for slaughter, 5 whose owners slaughter them and feel no guilt; those who sell them say, 'Blessed be the Lord, for I am rich'; and their shepherds do not pity them.
- 6 For I will no longer pity the inhabitants of the land," says the Lord. "But indeed, I will give everyone into their neighbor's hand and into the hand of his king. They shall attack the land, and I will not deliver them from their hand."
- 7 So I fed the flock for slaughter, in particular the poor of the flock. I took for myself two staffs: the one I called Beauty, and the other I called Bonds; and I fed the flock. 8 I dismissed the three shepherds in one month. My soul loathed them, and their soul also abhorred me.
- 9 Then I said, "I will not feed you. Let what is dying die, and what is perishing perish. Let those that are left eat each other's flesh." 10 And I took my staff, Beauty, and cut it in two, that I might break the covenant which I had made with all the peoples.
- 11 So it was broken on that day. Thus the poor of the flock, who were watching me, knew that it was the Word of the Lord. 12 Then I said to them, "If it is agreeable to you, give me my wages; and if not, refrain." So, they weighed out for my wages thirty pieces of silver.
- 13 And the Lord said to me, "Throw it to the potter"—that princely price they set on me. So, I took the thirty pieces of silver and threw them into the house of the Lord for the potter. 14 Then I cut in two my other staff, Bonds, that I might break the brotherhood between Judah and Israel.
- 15 And the Lord said to me, "Next, take for yourself the implements of a foolish shepherd. 16 For indeed I will raise up a shepherd in the land who will not care for those who are cut off, nor seek the young, nor heal those that are broken, nor feed those that still stand. But he will eat the flesh of the fat and tear their hooves in pieces.

17 "Woe to the worthless shepherd, Who --leaves the flock A sword shall be against his arm And against his right eye; His arm shall completely wither, And his right eye shall be totally blinded."

CHAPTER 12

1 The burden of the Word of the Lord against Israel. Thus says the Lord, who stretches out the heavens, lays the foundation of the earth, and forms the spirit of man within him: 2 "Behold, I will make Jerusalem a cup of drunkenness to all the surrounding peoples, when they lay siege against Judah and Jerusalem.

- 3 And it shall happen in that day that I will make Jerusalem a very heavy stone for all peoples; all who would heave it away will surely be cut in pieces, though all nations of the earth are gathered against it.
- 4 In that day," says the Lord, "I will strike every horse with confusion, and its rider with madness; I will open My eyes on the house of Judah and will strike every horse of the peoples with blindness. 5 And the governors of Judah shall say in their heart, 'The inhabitants of Jerusalem are my strength in the Lord of hosts, their God.'
- 6 In that day I will make the governors of Judah like a fire pan in the woodpile, and like a fiery torch in the sheaves; they shall devour all the surrounding peoples on the right hand and on the left, but Jerusalem shall be inhabited again in her own place—
 Jerusalem.
- 7 "The Lord will save the tents of Judah first, so that the glory of the house of David and the glory of the inhabitants of Jerusalem shall not become greater than that of Judah. 8 In that day the Lord will defend the inhabitants of Jerusalem; the one who is feeble among them in that day shall be like David, and the house of David shall be like God, like the Angel of the Lord before them. 9 It shall be in that day that I will seek to destroy all the nations that come against Jerusalem.
- 10 "And I will pour on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and supplication; then they will look on Me whom they pierced. Yes, they will mourn for Him as one mourns for his only son and grieve for Him as one grieves for a firstborn. 11 In that day there shall be a great mourning in Jerusalem, like the mourning at Hadad Rimmon in the plain of Megiddo.
- 12 And the land shall mourn, every family by itself: the family of the house of David by itself, and their wives by themselves; the family of the house of Nathan by itself, and their wives by themselves; 13 the family of the house of Levi by itself, and their wives by themselves; the family of Shimei by itself, and their wives by themselves; 14 all the families that remain, every family by itself, and their wives by themselves.

- 1 "In that day a fountain shall be opened for the house of David and for the inhabitants of Jerusalem, for sin and for uncleanness.
- 2 "It shall be in that day," says the Lord of hosts, "that I will cut off the names of the idols from the land, and they shall no longer be remembered. I will also cause the prophets and the unclean spirit to depart from the land. 3 It shall come to pass that if anyone still prophesies, then his father and mother who begot him will say to him, 'You shall not live, because you have spoken lies in the name of the Lord.' And his father and mother who begot him shall thrust him through when he prophesies.
- 4 "And it shall be in that day that every prophet will be ashamed of his vision when he

prophesies; they will not wear a robe of coarse hair to deceive. 5 But he will say, 'I am no prophet, I am a farmer; for a man taught me to keep cattle from my youth.' 6 And one will say to him, 'What are these wounds between your arms?' Then he will answer, 'Those with which I was wounded in the house of my friends.'

7 "Awake, O sword, against My Shepherd,

Against the Man who is My Companion,"

Says the Lord of hosts.

"Strike the Shepherd,

And the sheep will be scattered;

Then I will turn My hand against the little ones.

8 And it shall come to pass in all the land,"

Says the Lord,

"That two-thirds in it shall be cut off and die,

But one-third shall be left in it:

9 I will bring the one-third --through the Fire,

I Will Refine/purify them --as silver is refined,

And Test them --as Gold is Tested.

They will call on My name,

And I will answer them.

I will say, 'This is My people';

And each one will say, 'The Lord is my God.'"

CHAPTER 14

1 Behold, the Day of the Lord is coming,

And your spoil will be divided in your midst.

2 For I will gather all the nations to battle against Jerusalem;

The city shall be taken,

The houses rifled,

And the women ravished.

Half of the city shall go into captivity,

But the remnant of the people shall not be cut off from the city.

3 Then the Lord will go forth

And fight against those nations,

As He fights in the day of battle.

4 And in that day His feet will --stand on the Mount of Olives,

Which faces Jerusalem on the east.

And the Mount of Olives shall be split in two, From east to west, Making a very large valley; Half of the mountain shall move toward the north And half of it toward the south.

5 Then you shall flee through My mountain valley, For the mountain valley shall reach to Azal. Yes, you shall flee As you fled from the earthquake In the days of Uzziah king of Judah.

Thus the Lord my God will come, And all the Saints with You.

6 It shall come to pass in that day
That there will be no light;
The lights will diminish.
7 It shall be one day
Which is known to the Lord—
Neither day nor night.
But at evening time it shall happen
That it will be light.

8 And in that day it shall be
That living waters shall flow from Jerusalem,
Half of them toward the eastern sea
And half of them toward the western sea;
In both summer and winter it shall occur.
9 And the Lord shall be King over all the earth.
In that day it shall be—
"The Lord is one,"
And His name one.

10 All the land shall be turned into a plain from Geba to Rimmon south of Jerusalem. Jerusalem shall be raised up and inhabited in her place from Benjamin's Gate to the place of the First Gate and the Corner Gate, and from the Tower of Hananel to the king's winepresses.

11 The people shall dwell in it; And no longer shall there be utter destruction, But Jerusalem shall be safely inhabited.

12 And this shall be the plague with which the Lord will strike all the people who fought against Jerusalem:

Their flesh shall dissolve while they stand on their feet,

Their eyes shall dissolve in their sockets, And their tongues shall dissolve in their mouths.

13 It shall come to pass in that day
That a great panic from the Lord will be among them.
Everyone will seize the hand of his neighbor,
And raise his hand against his neighbor's hand;
14 Judah also will fight at Jerusalem.
And the wealth of all the surrounding nations
Shall be gathered together:
Gold, silver, and apparel in great abundance.

15 Such also shall be the plague
On the horse and the mule,
On the camel and the donkey,
And on all the cattle that will be in those camps.
So shall this plague be.

16 And it shall come to pass that everyone who is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall go up from year to year to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, and to keep the Feast of Tabernacles. 17 And it shall be that whichever of the families of the earth do not come up to Jerusalem to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, on them there will be no rain.

18 If the family of Egypt will not come up and enter in, they shall have no rain; they shall receive the plague with which the Lord strikes the nations who do not come up to keep the Feast of Tabernacles. 19 This shall be the punishment of Egypt and the punishment of all the nations that do not come up to keep the Feast of Tabernacles.

20 In that day --"Holiness To The Lord"-- shall be engraved on the bells of the horses. The pots in the Lord's house shall be like the bowls before the altar. 21 Yes, every pot in Jerusalem and Judah shall be holiness to the Lord of hosts. Everyone who sacrifices shall come and take them and cook in them. In that day there shall no longer be a Canaanite in the house of the Lord of hosts.
